This person will implement our Samaritan program in the day-to-day work of outreach to people experiencing homelessness and living on the street. By reaching toward our unsheltered neighbors and assisting them to engage in services - right where they are, we have great hope that they might trust us enough to allow us into their story. This team member will need to be very organized and task-oriented to accomplish the day-to-day objectives for this program, and will work together with a Navigator to develop the catchment area to maximize our resources and our impact.

Responsibilities:

Carry out the mission, vision and values of City Care. Know the resources available in the community and develop a network of contacts. Develop individualized plans with participants by working in collaboration to identify the self-directed goals of participants. Develop a relationship with each participant and promote health and housing at every encounter.

Eligibility:

Embodiment of City Care culture. Understand of the complexity of the intersection of poverty, homelessness, mental illness, substance use and recovery. Ability to reflect recovery principles. Previous experience in a recovery and justice environment. Skilled verbal and written communication. Ability to multi-task and handle stressful and complex situations. Ability to work as a member of a team to accomplish shared goals.

Requirements:

Bachelor degree or higher required. Behavioral Health Case Manager II. Background check. Reliable transportation.

Preferred:

Mental Health Technician. Behavioral Health Aide. Previous Case Management. Days/Hours: Part-time, temporary with the potential for permanent, 20-hours per week, days and hours are negotiable.
